SUBJECT: CJLEADS Pilot Project

Just 145 business days ago, the CJLEADS application was only a vision. With the dedication and the support of approximately 100 State and 20 SAS project team members, our partnership has supported the design and development of the CJLEADS pilot application. Each of you has played a valuable role in the work required to meet the objectives set forth by the Legislature. I commend you for the time and dedication you have shown as part of the CJLEADS team.

In May, the pilot application will provide integrated court, warrant, incarceration and probation information. At this time we will begin internal quality assurance and user testing. This effort will validate the integration of data, system and role-based security, application objectives, business rules, and ease of use. When the CJLEADS application has met the acceptance test criteria defined by the internal State project team, the pilot application will be made available to a select set of Wake County users for testing in normal work situations.

As we move beyond May 1st, considerable work remains, and your continued support will be needed. The SAS and State project teams will continue design and development to incorporate additional data sources such as Juvenile Court, Sex Offender, Concealed Handgun Permits, local jail booking, wildlife, DMV, federal and other states' information into the CJLEADS application. The team will also move forward with planning efforts for the migration of the pilot application to a State-hosted production environment.

As we move forward with the next phases of the CJLEADS pilot project, we will provide regular updates on the progress of the project. Please contact this office with any questions.
