CJLEADS April 2009 Bulletin

Project Update

On May 1, 2009, CJLEADS (Criminal Justice Law Enforcement Automated Data Services) will be available to the state project team for testing and validation. More than 50 state and 20 SAS Institute, Inc., project team members are working tirelessly to finalize business rules, develop testing scenarios and refine the user interface for the CJLEADS application. The project team has partnered with the National Institute of Justice and the NCSU Public Safety Leadership Initiative as well as with local subject matter experts to understand industry best practices in criminal justice information sharing and to further the efforts of the project.

CJLEADS is integrating data found within the state's various criminal justice applications and will provide up-to-date criminal information in a centralized location via a secure connection for use by state and local government criminal justice professionals.

The pilot application for Wake County has two primary objectives; to provide a comprehensive view of an offender through a single application; and to provide an "offender watch" capability to alert criminal justice professionals when an offender has a change in status within the criminal justice system.

Given the complexity of the criminal justice data and the regulatory, statutory, and contractual challenges to be addressed within the constraints of the pilot timeline, the pilot initially will include data from the Administrative Office of the Courts systems, including court case records, warrants and orders for arrest, and Department of Correction, including incarceration and probation information.

North Carolina information associated with juvenile court records, the sex offender registry, concealed handgun permits, local jail booking information, and North Carolina wildlife license and vessel information is currently being analyzed for planned integration during summer 2009. Analysis and planning for the implementation of other states' and federal data, available through the Division of Criminal Information message switch, is on-going.

From May 1, 2009 through September 29, 2009, CJLEADS will be hosted in a SAS environment for a period of user acceptance testing. During this time the State will verify data and validate the system functionality. The state project team will develop plans to migrate the application to a state production environment on completion of the user acceptance testing.

The pilot application for Wake County has two primary objectives; to provide a comprehensive view of an offender through a single application; and to provide an "offender watch" capability to alert criminal justice professionals when an offender has a change in status within the criminal justice system.
