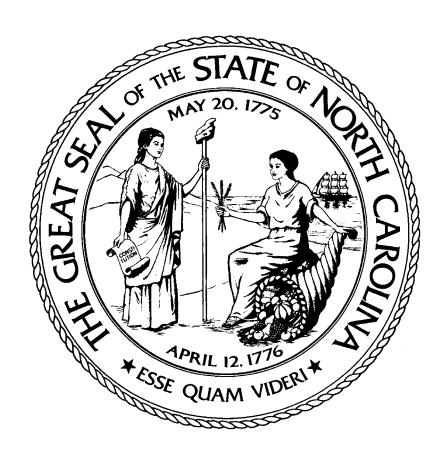

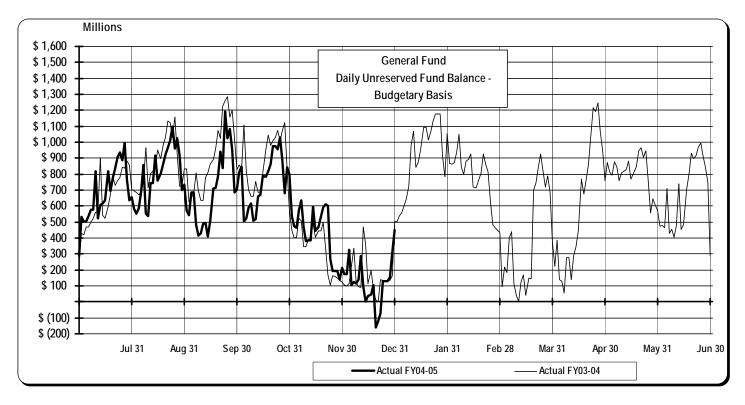

Note that the table represents net tax and non-tax collections and not gross collections. When compared to the prior year through December 31, actual tax and non-tax revenues increased by \$350.5 million, or 4.8%. The substantial decrease in non-tax other revenue is due to a transfer-in of \$108.8 million from reserves to generate additional funds for the 2004 fiscal year that did not occur in fiscal year 2005. The net, or actual, tax and non-tax revenues through December 2004 of \$7.7 billion were more than the projected revenues by \$75.9 million.

Major components of tax and non-tax revenues that increased or decreased from the prior year through the end of December 2004 included:

- \$149.2 million for Individual Tax;
- \$135.5 million for Corporate Income;

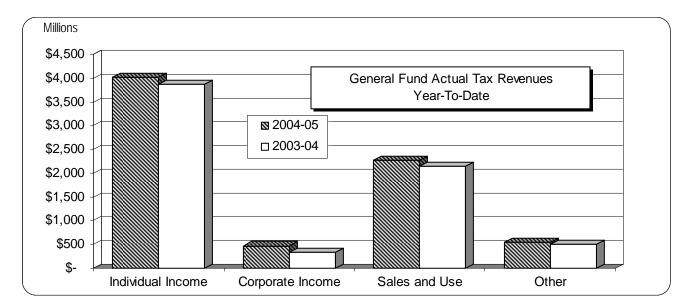

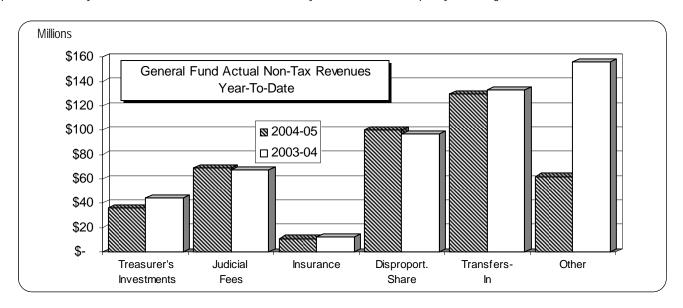

Tax revenues through December 2004 were more than the period through December 2003 by \$450.6 million, or 6.6%. Tax revenues are presented net of refunds to taxpayers and various transfers. Comparisons of current and prior year tax revenues are difficult due to legislative changes and netting of various transfer expenditures against the tax revenue sources. Examples of such transfers include:

- reimbursements to local governments;
- reimbursements for costs of administration of sales and use tax for local governments; and
- transfers to the Public School Building Capital Fund and Critical School Facility Needs Fund.



Non-tax revenue through the end of December 2004 was \$100.1 million, or 19.7%, less than through the end of December 2003. The substantial decrease in non-tax other revenue is due to a transfer-in of \$108.8 million from reserves to generate additional funds for the 2004 fiscal year that is not planned for fiscal year 2005. Investment revenues decreased by \$7.9 million from the prior year through the end of December.

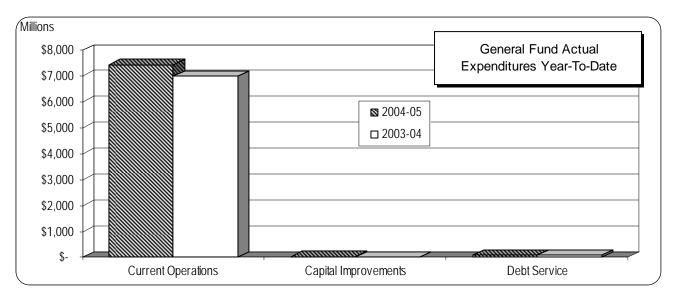

Expenditures

Actual appropriation expenditures through December 2004 were more than actual appropriation expenditures through December 2003 by \$446.1 million, or 6.3%.



Expenditures for current operations (exclusive of expenditures for capital improvements and debt service) through December 2004 were more than such expenditures through December 2003 by \$433.7 million, or 6.2%.
